You Said

We listen to the concerns of the community and our priorities are set by local people who sit on a neighbourhood panel. You said the following priorities were important to you:

- Drugs and Anti Social Behaviour (ASB)
- Drugs and Anti Social Behaviour (ASB), Agar Grove and Barker

We Did

We have done the following to tackle these priorities:

Drugs and Anti Social Behaviour (ASB)

We have moved a large number of people from the area using our dispersal powers. These individuals have either been involved in youth ASB or drug related activity. Once dispersed, this power prevents those involved from returning to the location for up to 24 hours. Whilst we have a dispersal notice in place we will continue to utilise and enforce this throughout 2013. We work closely with Community Safety Team at the council and continually view CCTV from the area. This has had great results as youths identified from CCTV have been visited by council officers and police. On most occasions, warning letters were sent to residents involved, warning them of further action being taken with regards to breaching tenancy agreements if this behaviour continues. A quantity of drugs was also recovered from the area. The drugs were believed to be sixteen rocks of crack and a tub of herbal Cannabis. A quantity of drugs was also recovered from the area. that affects our residents quality of life and keep you safe.

Drugs and Anti Social Behaviour (ASB), Agar Grove and Barker Drive

We have increased patrols in the area concentrating on stairwells and points of access. There have been reduced levels of ASB calls across the Estate. Officers have identified locations where drugs are becoming more prominent; we have been identified offenders and taken action. This includes dispersals, arrests and drug seizures. We will continue to deliver a high level of quality policing throughout 2013, we are committed to reducing crime, fear of crime and engaging with the community to meet the needs of residents. We will continue to work closely with our partners and panel members throughout 2013.

Street Briefings

Once a month we hold a street briefing within the ward. The location of these briefings change from month. This provides us with a chance to meet all the community and discuss any concerns they have, of even just say hello. We are keen to meet our community and ensure we are doing everything we can to keep them safe. Dates and times of future briefings can be found on our website or give us a call.
